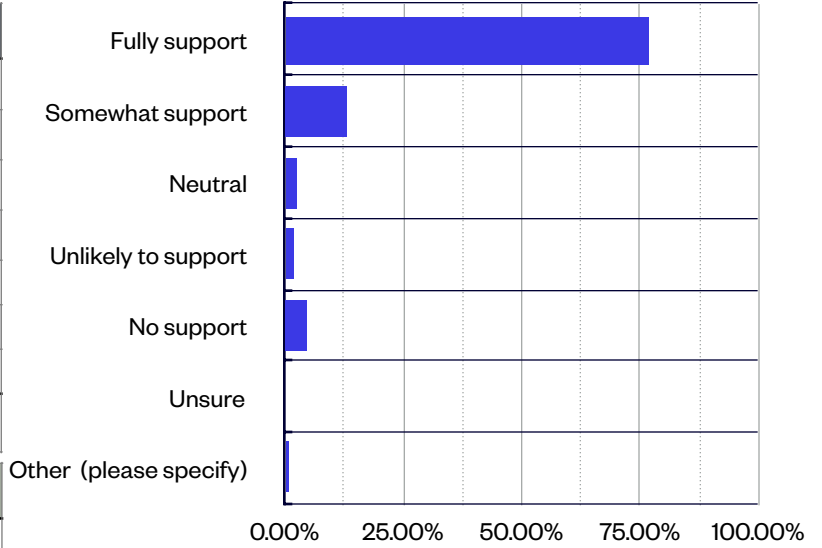


# CO RxP Survey

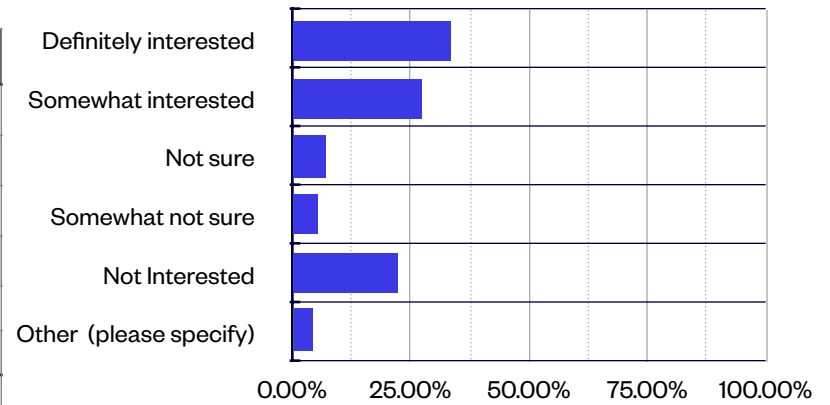
