Chair-Elect

- One year-term as Chair-elect and then serves as Chair the year following.
- The Chair leads COPAGS and is the graduate student counterpart to the CPA Board President position.

Programming Chair

- Develops and implements programming across the state of Colorado that appeals and benefits graduate students of psychology.
- Examples of previous events include: educational programming, networking events, fostering communication amongst graduate students with similar professional interests.

Diversity Chair

- Acts to insure that COPAGS is aware of and has a consistent focus on issues of diversity and cultural competence.
- Represents and advocates for the needs of diverse individuals in graduate psychology training as well as communities served by graduate students.

Advocacy Chair

- Responsible for leadership projects geared towards advocating for Colorado graduate students as well as disenfranchised groups.
- Activities of prior advocacy chairs have included: facilitating an event about refugee mental health, social media town hall to connect graduate students with a senator supporting mental health reform, and connecting COPAGS members with CPA Psychologists to increase COPAGS' presence within CPA.
